Health and Social Care is the study of health and well-being. Students learn about the key stages of physical and emotional development and begin to understand the profound influence relationships and life events can have on an individual's health. Students also examine the factors that influence a person's self-concept and how people react to change in their lives. The Health and Social Care Department in Holy Cross College works in partnership with various care settings throughout the community, in order to provide experience of health and social care in different contexts for our students.

Many students with qualifications in Health and Social Care go on to have interesting and successful careers in childcare, nursing, medicine, midwifery, social work, teaching, paramedics, counselling, health-visiting and the allied health professions. In 2013, 66,061 people were directly employed across local health and social care organisations in Northern Ireland; the vast majority (81%) were women. Overall between 2004 and 2013, the Northern Ireland Health and Social Care Workforce increased by 12.3% which means that this is a growth employment sector in Northern Ireland. **Opportunities for employment within the Northern Ireland Health and Social Care sector are broken down as follows:**
